## **RNQG PROGRAMS 2011-2012**

Guild meetings are held on the third Wednesday of the month at the Italian-American Club, 109 Stone Street, Walpole, MA. Unless stated otherwise, all workshops are held at All About Quilts, 958 Main Street, Walpole, MA and run from 9:30AM to 4 PM.

Workshop fees: \$60 for RNQG members, \$65 for non-RNQG members. Additional costs (if applicable) are listed in program description. Any non-RNQG member registered for a workshop may attend the guild meeting preceding the workshop free of charge.

Workshop fees are due at the time of registration. If you register for a workshop and find you are unable to attend, there are NO refunds from RNQG. You may find a replacement for your spot and have that individual pay you directly.

### **May 16, 2012: Merry May**

#### **“Nothing Up My Hanging Sleeve”**

Unusual and entertaining tips and tricks from “The Fudgemaster’s” thirty years of quiltmaking experience. Topics include: “Alternative Shopping,” and “Things My Grandmother Taught Me.” There are many visual samples. Merry is best known for writing mystery quilt instructions under the pen name of “Inspector Cluesew” which began in 1992. Her mysteries have appeared in several magazines, as well as through online venues. Merry was the first person (under the sponsorship of Planet Patchwork and Quiltropolis) to offer a one-day online mystery “workshop,” complete with a chat room for participants. She “retired” the Cluesew name in 2003 and re-launched her popular mystery quilts under the name of “Merry Mahem.”

### **May 17, 2012: Full-day Workshop with Merry May**

#### **“Rags to Riches Scrap Quilts”**

Beginning with a fabric swap of 4 inch squares, the class moves on to making order out of chaos, and finally assembles the squares into an easy block design with many layout possibilities. ## Greetings From a Former Guild Member

Rebecca Bradbury, a former member of RNQG, has fond memories of the guild. Her recent letter follows:

*I was looking up quilt shows today and then looked up Rhododendron, my first quilt guild. Until my husband moved me to Maine in 2008, I enjoyed being an active member for 20 years and remember fondly all the fabulous shows, speakers, and workshops, many which I took part in. From the newsletter and website I see that you are all continuing to inspire each other and spread the love of quilting. The work you've done on the website is great. I was interested in reading the newsletters and I like the listings of shows and activities (hoping to find something for May 19, 2012). I especially enjoyed the new photo section of people and projects, some even with labels. It's really nice to see some familiar faces and the Show and Tell items are inspiring.*

*Last summer/fall I met up with Bonnie Vinson and Nancy Pond, who have always inspired me with their fantastic creative skills. We got together for quilting a couple of times before I had to head back to Maine. During our visit we talked about an old project I started during my Rhododendron days. In 1990, RNQG had a speaker from W. Springfield, MA, Joanne Parisi. Her presentation was titled "Olde is New" and consisted of using new fabrics to make nine-patch blocks set with sashing and small 4-patch blocks connecting the sashing.*

*The premise was to choose fabrics that weren't exactly what we liked (that "ugly" fabrics would give the blocks more of a feeling of being old). Gail Sturgis and I took our hand-outs from Joanne home and began our quilts. Gail finished her in the 1990's but I grew disillusioned with my project. Last year (2011) after attending the Maine Quilts Show, I was inspired to resurrect that project. I brought that "quilt" to MA with me and signed up for a "Help" class at Quilter's Stash. Under the guidance of a most talented teacher (sorry I can't recall her name right now) I was back on track. The visits with Bonnie and Nancy followed. By the end of the second visit, with much encouragement from Bonnie and Nancy, I pledged to finish the quilt top before the end of October. And I did it! Sent pictures to Bonnie and Nancy and was very satisfied with myself. The quilt top that I once disliked very much was now complete and now I loved it! (Quilt top photo at right)*

*I am now involved with 3 quilt groups, 2 in my area and 1 is in Calais (which I don't get often as it is over an hour away). Please feel free to share my photo and any information about the project (edited as you wish) on your website. The original quilt plan from Joanne Parisi was for the blocks to be plainly set horizontally and vertically. I changed the design by placing the*



*blocks into vertical rows, which I found to be much more pleasing. I wonder how many of your current members will remember this speaker and project from 1990!*

*I will try to check your website more frequently to see what inspiring work everyone is doing. I believe you'll have a quilt show next year (2013). Hope it might be convenient for me to attend. Please tell all my quilting friends "Hello from Maine".*
