Boutique Update

The Quilt Show Boutique is a significant source of guild revenue so *please* participate!

- As soon as possible please let us know if you plan to sell items in the Boutique and give us a ballpark idea of what you plan to donate or consign along with item types and quantities.
- For those of you participating in the Boutique by either consigning or donating items, you may want to stay on the ZOOM guild meeting call after our regular Feb 19th meeting for a Boutique tutorial. We'll do a similar tutorial at our in- person RNQG guild meeting on March19th. We'll show you how to package, tag, and list your items on the Donate/Consign Inventory sheets followed by question and answers. Help us keep the Q and A sessions brief by reading the Boutique documentation beforehand, specifically the two guideline documents and the two Inventory documents from the guild website or get hardcopy from the Boutique Box at *All About Quilts*.
- Thanks to everyone who attended, taught, or hosted a Boutique workshop. All items
 made in a Boutique workshop (except for Mini Quilts (MQ's)) should be listed on your
 Donation Inventory sheet and handed into the Boutique along with the other items that
 you want to donate or consign on Set-Up day, Friday April 4th 2025.
- All your unsold items, donated or consigned will be returned to you at the end of the show (except for MQ's).
- MQs can be given to Dottie or Jacqui at any time, preferably sooner rather than later. No need to tag them or list them on an inventory sheet as they are priced by the Boutique chairs and become the property of the guild. Having MQ's asap will help us plan how to display them at the show.
- Between now April, look for emails with additional Boutique updates, including alternate ways to drop off your saleable items and information on item drop-off during the show setup (Friday April 4th).

Our guild is invited to submit one quilt (selected by our membership at the April meeting) for inclusion in this special exhibition. The quilts will not be judged at the Museum exhibit, but a Viewers' Choice Award will be presented. The winning guild will be invited to display its members' quilts in the Genre Gallery of the New England Quilt Museum in 2026.

Holliston, MA Staycation

This three-day quilting event will be Friday, February 28th to Sunday March 1st at Christ the King Lutheran Church, 600 Central Street, Holliston. Yankee members will provide Friday supper, Saturday soup lunch and supper, and bagels and cream cheese on Sunday morning. Coffee, tea, water and snacks are offered throughout. A refrigerator and microwave are available for those who bring their own food.
