March is the month for nominations to the RNQG board for next year. As always, a number of positions will open at the end of this fiscal year.

No prior experience is necessary – just a passion for quilting, a positive outlook, and the desire to help RNQG to adapt to changing times. Short job descriptions can be found on the RNQG website as described in the "Website News" article. More detailed information is available from current board members.

One position which has been vacant for several years is "Publicity". The publicity committee is expected to distribute information about upcoming meetings and workshops "to increase attendance at Guild activities and to increase public awareness of Guild members and activities". It is likely that with advertising, the guild will have an easier time filling workshops – which means it will be able to continue hosting workshops with nationally-recognized quilters!

Publicity in the electronic age is actually simpler than it was when the guild was born. Many newspapers have on-line forms for submitting items to their calendar. A few use email. For both cases, the text can be entered once in your favorite word processing program, then cut-and-pasted for each newspaper submission...no paper, no stamps, no trips to the P.O. And we already have a list of local newspapers and their submission requirements.

So...as you contemplate how you can help the guild next year, remember that not all tasks require a huge time commitment...and many jobs can be shared! You'll never find a nicer group of people to work with!





Block of the Month

Block of the Month is an opportunity to try out some new techniques and designs, showcase your skills and use up some scraps. If you are a lucky winner, you will go home with the beginning of a nice quilt or wall hanging. Block of the Month is a unifying activity - a chance to see different approaches to the same block and to admire each other's work.

This is how it works: Each month any member who choosees to participate makes a block (or several) using a predetermined design and color scheme. At the montly meeting they are turned in and displayed for all to admire! Each maker puts his/her name on a slip of paper and into a basket - one slip for each block made. (If you really like a particular block, make several so you have more chances to win them all.) At the conclusion of the business meeting, a name is drawn from the basket and the lucky winner takes home ALL the blocks.

I am assuming a 1/4" seam allowance. Please use 100% cotton, prewashed for color stability. The size given in the instructions include the seam allowance to join the blocks together. "Finished" size does not include the seam allowance.

March Block of the Month - "Indian Star"
Let's make this a "stash buster" by using assorted light, medium and dark fabrics.

April Block of the Month - "Pineapple Blossom" Lets make this a "stash buster" by using scraps of darks and lights, with a red center to the block.





May Block of the Month - Applique Floral Wreath For this block, we will use a white or white on white for the background and scraps for the applique.



- 31 states have hosted the auilt




"THE SUPPER QUILT"
