

Ami Simms

"Twisted Sisters"

In this pattern, light and dark fabrics are stitched or "sistered" together, sliced, and recombined to make twisting pinwheel-type blocks that fit together with or without sashing strips. Other options include floating the pinwheels, folding 3-dimensional block centers, and experimenting with leftover chunks, bits, and pieces to create more quilts. You'll have a lot of choices. Ami is shown above wearing a sample of the pattern.

Quilt designer, author and teacher from Summerfield, Florida, (transplanted from the Cape). She has developed an exciting and easy appliqué technique called Appli-bond. It is the fusing of 2 or more layers of fabric together with a bonding material. The pieces are attached to the background fabric with embroidery stitches and the edges remaining free, creating a realistic 3-d appearance. This will appeal both to beginners and as well as experts.

She has written 3 books, has published article in many magazines and has an extensive pattern line called "Petal Play". She has taught nationally and internationally, made many TV appearances and is featured on many quilt cruises. Joan offers an exciting trunk show featuring approximately 60 quilts.

Comfort Quilts

Thanks to all who took a quilt kit in the fall. At the last quilt-a-thon in Sherborne people worked on the 1600 jelly roll quilts for comfort quilts. By using fewer strips, and making a few extra cuts, the quilt turns out to the comfort quilt size of 40 x 56.

With everyone finishing up their quilts from the holidays and from the show, you may have some extra blocks that could be used for a comfort quilt. Mix with some of your left over scraps and make a quilt top. If you don't feel like quilting the top with a flannel back, donate the top to Comfort Quilts. And if you have some blocks, but don't have time to make a top, donate those extra blocks, and some volunteer will turn the blocks into a quilt top or quilt. You can drop the blocks, tops, and quilts off at the comfort quilt table at the quilt show.

The world of quilting has moved way beyond pretty patchwork bedcovers. Case in point: an exhibition of art quilts opening this Thursday, January 17th at the New England Quilt Museum. Created by 36 artists based in fourteen different countries on three continents, these vibrant works represent the very best in modern art.

The *Masters II* exhibition is the follow-up to the original *Masters* exhibition of works by members of SAQA (Studio Art Quilt Associates), including a touring collection and a companion book by guest curator and SAQA Executive Director Martha Sielman (Storrs, CT). Like the first, this

exhibition includes a companion book featuring several works by each of the artists represented in the touring exhibition. The book is for sale in the NEQM Store.

Masters II runs through April 13, 2013.
