Comfort Quilts

RNQG members have donated 22 quilts to the Power of the Quilt Project, either completely finished, or quilted tops that others made, or donated tops that were then quilted by others. In addition, at our retreat in March, members assembled six large quilt and beautiful tops that will be donated to the Martha's Vineyard project. , and 3 tops donated at MQX for wheelchair patients. Useful lengths of flannel backing and fabric were generously donated by guild members to the Power of the Quilt Project. Two of our members attended a class in April to learn how to use a longarm quilting machine to finish quilts, and two quilts have already been quilted as a result of that class. I would like to add that if anyone has quilts out that they volunteered to finish, please return them to Cris Crawford at the May or June meeting. There are still a few sandwiched quilts that I could hand out over the summer. Please contact Cris at crawford.cris@gmail.com if you would like a quilt to finish over the summer, or if you would like flannel or batting to make a quilt from a top that you provide."

This year the Power of the Quilt Project conducted three quiltathons which were attended by members of RNQG, the Unitarian Universalist Area Church in Sherborn, and quilters from the surrounding community. We were able to donate nearly 40 quilts to the Harvard Vanguard Cancer Treatment Center in Kenmore Square, the Martha's Vineyard project, and over a dozen quilts that were requested by individuals who had a family member or friend undergoing cancer treatment. As always please contact Cris Crawford if you know someone who could use a quilt in this manner. She keeps a number of quilts on hand for this purpose.

Thank you one and all ...

In addition to working on their own projects, several RNQG retreat participants worked together at the most recent quilting retreat on Cape Cod (March 11 - 13) to make six comfort quilt tops which were then donated to the **Power of the Quilt Project**.

Cris Crawford, PQP coordinator, had volunteers finish these quilts at the April 2nd Power of the Quilt Project quilt-a-thon. The completed comfort quilts will be donated to a shelter for homeless women on Martha's Vineyard.

A special note of thanks to Terry Greenstein, event organizer, who designed the quilts. Terry handed out 24 kits to make the large "O"-shaped blocks. Other quilters joined the blocks together.



A representative from the Vineyard shelter came to our April guild meeting to thank our guild for this gift of comfort quilts. It was so nice of her to make her way all the way to Walpole to give us her thanks. I hope our members can see that your contributions to our comfort quilts are truly welcomed and appreciated.

Our Next Quilt Show committee meeting is scheduled for June 1 at the Walpole library. All committee chairs are

asked to please attend.

We are making great progress in filling our chair positions for our March 2017 Quilt show. We had our first show committee meeting in Jan with a great attendance and lot of great ideas and conversations. We have made several changes which we hope will help make our show an even better event. I still have a few very important open chair positions. They are-

<u>Show set up</u> - this person is in charge of a crew of helpers who will put the quilt racks up according to the floor design and hanging the quilts on the assigned racks. You will have several helpers assigned but it would be helpful if the chair person for this has some experience working on this committee at past shows. You would need to be available for this during the set up time period on Friday.

<u>Show Take Down</u>- Leads a crew with taking the racks and quilts down and packing the racks back into their tubs. The quilts are put back in bags and handed over to Quilt Central for quilters to pick up.

Quilt Central- Leads a crew in organizing the collection of the quilts before the show (usually at the Guild meeting before the show), transports the quilts to the show on Friday at the time of setup. Your crew will work in conjunction with the Set up committee in getting the quilts to the correct rack. At the time of take down, quilts are handed out to the quilters after the show is done. We have made a few changes to this process in hopes of making it go as smooth as possible and not blocking the doorway

Preview of our Sept 2016- June 2017 RNQG Programs

9/14/16- Welcome to a new Guild year at RNQG. Reconnect with old friends and meet some new ones. *Lisa Steinka* will be presenting a preview of the programs for the year. Get excited to try new projects, learn and be inspired!

10/19/16 <u>Cynthia England</u> <u>'Getting the most out of your</u> Stash' This lecture explores ways to increase the potential of what we already have in our fabric collections. Cynthia will offer new insights on what to look for in fabrics to get the most out of it; a topic that is near and dear to all of quilters! Organizing and storage of fabrics will also be addressed.

10/20/16 (Thursday workshop) <u>Cynthia England - 'Picture Piecing Design</u>.- A two-part class where you will learn how to piece a small landscape as well as get a feel for how to design your own project using the Picture Piecing technique.. For the sewing portion, Students can choose from two small landscapes. Irons required.

11/16/16- <u>*Pat Harrison*</u> will present <u>"You Be The Judge"</u> A 45-minute PowerPoint lecture that presents the steps a quilt judge follows as they evaluate a quilt. Also discusses why you should consider having your quilt judged, the types of judging formats used, and the rationale behind your guild hosting a judged show. A trunk show follows as does a period of questions and answers. Pat is an <u>NACQJ Certified Quilt Judge</u>.

11/19/16 (Saturday workshop) <u>*Esterita Austin*</u>- Layered <u>Monoprints with</u> <u>Sheers</u>-In this new and innovative monoprinting class you will print on sheer organza by using various marking tools: paint, markers, oil crayons..etc with fusible web and parchment to take the printing process to a new level. By cutting away and layering the sheer prints you can create depth and interest. It's a new technique that will add to your creative arsenal.

1/18/17- *Pam Weeks*- Everything old is new Again- Quilting is nearly as old as cloth, and I whiz through its history, concentrating on examples from the eighteenth through twentieth centuries. I debunk a few popular quilt history myths, and touch on New England textile mill and technology history. Attendees are invited to bring one quilt for identification. Quilts are arranged in chronological order and used as examples in the lecture.

1/21/17- (Saturday workshop) *Michele O'Neil Kincaid*- Lady Slipper Trapunto I've always liked linking history with today's techniques and this one works in nicely. In the 16th and 17th centuries quilting and trapunto in particular was used as padding under suits of armor and as decorative clothing accents. My class will include original methods up to and including machine methods. We'll cord 'stems' and pad leaves and generally go with the flow! After stitching you will add color to the flowers using colored pencils, markers, and crayons. My nod to mixed media.

2/15/17- *Michelle Tade Benton*- From Concept to Consumer What is the process of designing fabric, having it printed and delivered to your local quilt shop? Probably much more that you ever considered.






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
