RNQG meetings are held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of the month, from September through June.



We hope that you will decide to try some of the workshops as they present different techniques that will enhance your quilting skills.

**SEPTEMBER 27** – Please note that we are meeting a week later due to Rosh Hashanah. **Summer Challenge** – please bring in your summer challenge quilts for all to see and vote on.

A **Power Point** presentation of all of the programs and workshops for the year will be presented. We will have samples from some of the teachers this year to illustrate what they will be teaching. Members will have the opportunity to sign up for the programs.

Ann Shaw's patterns will be available for purchase so that you can begin to collect fabrics for next month's workshop.



# OCTOBER 18 -Workshop - Ann Shaw - Flowers of the Gorge (SAME DAY AND PRIOR to MEETING)

Flowers have been an enduring source of inspiration for quilters; many traditional quilt blocks feature flower patterns. The remarkable array of miniature wildflowers that can be found in the Columbia River Gorge and surrounding hills of the Cascade Mountains

inspired my series of flower designs. Based on the design and piecing techniques of Ruth McDowell, these designs take traditional patchwork a step further through the use of unexpected fabric choices. Join us in celebrating the beauty of flowers. We will learn the basics of Ruth piecing techniques and her fascinating use of fabrics.



# Meeting - Ann Shaw - Photos and Quilts

In this presentation, she will discuss the ways in which she adapts photographs in her pieced quilt designs, her approach to taking pictures that inspire her pictorial quilts, and the design choices that affect the look of her quilts. She discusses what inspired the idea of "Gesture" and how she introduced this composition technique into

the quilt world in 2015.

## Carol Anne Grotrian - Quilts with a View: New Landscape Traditions

American artists, including needle workers have naturally turned to the land for inspiration. This lecture touches on the appearance of landscape in antique quilts, looks at the diverse views and viewpoints of contemporary quilters and, on a personal note, includes a few of my landscape quilts among projected images and in person.

# NOVEMBER 18 and FEBRUARY 3, 2018 Workshop - Snapshot: Start A Picture Quilt

Create fabric pictures--landscape, still life, etc.-- based on assigned snapshots that you bring to class. Pick your favorite photo and adapt it to quilting, using simple tools like photocopies and tracing paper. Begin selecting fabrics that will bring the image to life. The first day the class will produces designs on paper. We will return in February to fuse the fabric sketches.

This evening our guild members will bring their machines to the meeting and we will participate in making comfort quilts. Some of us will be cutting fabric, others sewing, others ironing and at the end of the evening we hope to have a number of quilts created.

# Workshop - Bob Harrison - Featherweight Maintenance

This will be a half-day (3½ hour) workshop covering all the aspects of cleaning, oiling, and polishing of your Featherweight, Singer's fabulous Model #221/222. All aspects of Featherweight maintenance are demonstrated using a live feed camera for greater visibility and enlargement of the machine's interior. After demonstrations, students

then perform the same tasks on their own Featherweights so that they leave the workshop confident in their own skills at keeping their little machine humming happily along. Machine parts and accessories are available at the workshop as are simple repairs.



MARCH 21 - Kathy Graves - Modern Quilting Lecture and Trunk Show Kathy will be here to explore the Modern Quilt movement with us. Modern quilts are constructed using a group of techniques and characteristics that identify them as "Modern", although Modern quilters are varied in their style. Kathy will explore the various techniques used by Modern quilters including minimalism, negative space, improv, use of bold colors and graphics, modern traditionalism, and alternative grid structures. Her

presentation will include quilt photos from QuiltCon, the Modern Quilt Show. Kathy will also present a trunk show, using her personal quilts as examples of various Modern techniques.



# MARCH 24 - Kathy Graves - Metro Rings Workshop: A Contemporary version of Double Wedding Ring Quilt

Together we will explore and learn the fast, fun way to sew curves (without clipping or pinning) using the Quick Curve Ruler by Sew Kind of Wonderful. Their clever pattern allows for making oversized blocks and squaring up for improved accuracy and take the stress out of making seams exact. You will use 2.5" stripes either from precuts or fabric to make the curved -section. You will be amazed how easily your design will come together.



APRIL 18 - Timna Tarr - Trunk Show - Flying Colors

Timna is known for making fun, colorful, award-winning quilts. Join her for this trunk show of her quilting journey. She talks about her design and color choices, as well as the personal stories behind the quilts.

#### APRIL 19 - WORKSHOPS

## **Designing with Flying Colors (2-3 hours, no sewing)**

Are you stuck in a color rut? Or are you afraid that you might make a color "mistake" in your quilts? In this workshop, students try out new color combinations and learn how to use color placement as a major

design element. Participants should bring 10, 6" squares of different fabrics from their stash to the workshop.

**Map Quilts (3 hours, sewing)** In this three-hour workshop participants learn to make a quilted map based on a paper map. Everyone in the group works from the same map, which will be a map of Cape Cod.







## MAY 16 - Pam Weeks - "Jane Stickled Revealed"

Pam Weeks, the Binney Family Curator of the New England Quilt Museum, will lecture on her newest topic. In the 150th anniversary year of the making of the Jane Stickle quilt, she was invited to examine and do further research on this iconic Civil War quilt. Her lecture reveals the results of her research and sheds light on the life of this Vermont farm wife who

made an incredible quilt.

There are a number of guild members who have been working on a Dear Jane quilt for a number of years. We invite all members who have made a Dear Jane quilt to bring them to the meeting this evening.





## JUNE 20 - Sue Bleisweiss - Trunk Show

Sue, an award-winning full-time fiber artist will provide us with a trunk show for our final evening. Working with her own hand dyed cotton she creates vibrant, whimsical colorful art quilts intended to delight the eye of the viewer and draw them in for a closer look.
