Volunteer Help Needed!

Hi folks,

I could really need some more help for the Friday Set Up. We need people to bring ladders and we need people to climb ladders to set up the quilts.

Shifts are:

- 11-1 - Taping the floors for the vendor booths and the rack lay out.
- 12- Setting out the racks on the tape marks and getting the quilts organized.
- 1-3, 3-5, 5-7 - I need 4 teams of 3 people each to hang the quilts.

At 1 pm we can get into the cafeteria and the same thing happens. I need tapers to mark vendor booths and teams to set up the Hoffman Challenge racks and then hang those quilts. Same shifts apply- 1-3, 3-5, 5-7. If we fill those shifts we can get this done quickly.

Saturday and Sunday still need helpers too.

If you email me, Lsteinka@verizon.net I can fill in the slots. I will have the sheets at the meeting and we can fill them in there too. Looks like it's shaping up to be a great show again. Let's all do our part to help out

Important Information from Quilt Central

By now I suspect your quilts are ready or almost ready for the show.

Please read the following check list:

- You have a 4" sleeve on the back of your quilt.
- You have printed your quilt entry Label (from your email) and pinned it to the back of your quilt.
- You have remembered to write the name of the person picking up your quilt on your label if you personally are not going to pick it up. We can only release it to the person listed as quilter or designated pick up person.
- You will fold your quilt with the label facing the outside in a sturdy plastic bag.
- Ziploc Big Bags are the preferred choice. They can be purchased at the supermarket, Target, Lowes, Home Depot, etc.
- Your quilt should be dropped off at the March guild meeting prior to the show, or at Jane McClellan's house by appointment during the week prior to the show.
- Jane lives at 4 Redman Rd., Canton 781-828-7264.
- Do NOT plan to bring them to the show on Friday! If you can't bring them to the two locations above, then have a friend drop them at these two locations.

Quilt Central heartily thanks you for following the above steps for preparation and drop off; and for following the directions below for pickup:

- You may pick up your quilt at the conclusion of the show between 5-6 pm NO EARLIER
- You can access Quilt Central through the outside double doors between the gym and the cafeteria. Early birds will be able to wait in the warmth of the cafeteria prior to picking up their quilts. A designated guild volunteer will direct you to the gym location at 5pm
- No one will be allowed access to the gym through the door by the lobby - that exit will be in use by vendors exiting the show with their goods.

Quilt Category: For those that were not at the Feb meeting, I did announce that the "group" category did not meet the minimum number of entries to be awarded ribbons. Just don't want any surprises.

Still in need: We could still use a few more tripod easels to hold posters. For those that have volunteered theirs, please bring them on Friday. If anyone else has one, please let me know. I would like a couple more.

Volunteers: We still need to fill spaces for workers for Friday set up, and of course during the show. If you can contribute more time than you are signed up for, or if you have not taken on any jobs and would like to do so, please contact Lisa Steinka at lsteinka@verizon.net

Membership Drive: We will be actively promoting memberships for RNQG at the quilt show. In an effort to make those who join feel welcome, we need more of our current members to sign up to be "big sisters". Our hope is that the new

members name will be given to a current member who would call that new member in the week or so after the show. Make the call; introduce yourself; tell her about the guild; make sure she has the info about our next meeting; and that is the extent of what we are asking of you. The signup sheet will be at the March meeting. Please help us in the effort to make new members feel welcome.

FROM MEMBERSHIP

We will be actively recruiting new members at the quilt show. We will staff the membership table with some of our warmest and friendliest members to showcase our guild. This year we are initiating a Big Sister Mentor Program. Each new member that joins at the show will get the usual 3 free meetings for the rest of the 2016-2017 year AND be assigned a big sister with that quilter’s contact information that day. They will also receive a name tag (thank you Joanne Beaupre for making them ahead), be sent the latest newsletter, and directory within the following week. They will receive a call from the assigned big sister within a week to make contact and welcome the new member. The big sister should also make a point of inviting the new member to the April meeting, meet up with her there, and be ready to introduce the new member at the meeting. Some of our current members have signed up to be a big sister mentors. There will continue to be signup sheets at our show table at the guild meeting.

BUCK A BLOCK

New for the 2017 Quilt Show, Karen LeBlanc is the Chairperson and will be working together with the Comfort Quilt chairperson, Marie Fowler.

- 1) I want to encourage visitors to sit and sew a block whether they are non-sewers or professional sewers.
- 2) There will be a 12 ½ inch square and two small squares with the line drawn on the diagonal to be sewn on opposite corners. For \$1.00 visitors can sit and sew a block to take home or sit and sew a 6 ½ inch and two small squares to be incorporated into a Charity Quilt for the RNQG Guild. Also, I will have fabric pens available for personal messages.

Comfort Quilts

I want to thank everyone who has brought fabric to revive Comfort Quilts. We are in the beginning stages. I would like us to have available at least 20 quilts to give out. We are looking for fabric (men’s, women’s and boys and girls). We can also use backings and batting. (We can piece batting if necessary). We are accepting unfinished quilts, orphan blocks and everything in-between. As far as sizes we are flexible and open to all sizes. (Adults should be a generous lap, teenager’s size should be lap size and children smaller).

Also if you want to make a complete quilt yourself that would be appreciated but any portion will be great. We will be handing out quilt tops to be quilted and bound.

We are planning on having a sew-a-thon on Saturday, May 6, 2017 from 9 am to 3 pm at the American Legion Post 24 (behind the Canton High School) 950R Washington St., Canton, MA to make comfort quilts. We are looking for volunteers for this event. Please sign up at the meeting or e-mail me at mfsew222@gmail.com to let me know what times you will be available. If you can bring a sewing machine, please let me know. If anyone knows of an organization in need of quilts or an individual in need of comfort, please contact me so we can provide this wonderful service.

The Quilted Canvas: The Crit Group: 30 Years and Still Quilting

January 11 through April 29, 2017

This exhibit of works by five artists in fiber is a unique insight into the relationships of a critique group. Judy Becker, Nancy Crasco, Sandy Donabed, Sylvia Einstein, and Carol Anne Grotrian have been meeting each month for thirty years to support and sustain each other as artists. Nancy Crasco states, “the focus of our gatherings is always about the work: assisting with aesthetic and construction concerns, sharing opportunities to exhibit, discussing current trends in fiber, and providing the impetus to continue creating.” All of the artists have gained national recognition and have exhibited widely in the United States and abroad. Each of the artists has a distinct style which is acknowledged and encouraged by the others. They agree that the scariest outcome of a critique group would be to have their works be similar. Each artist has a different source of motivation or inspiration and employs a unique manner of working.
