Remember to cut 1/2" of the fabric above the selvage edge. Sign up information to follow. If you don't intend to take the workshop, please consider collecting your selvages for a member who is.

Our Members Teaching Members session is planned for Saturday, March 23rd at the Knights of Columbus Hall from 10 to 2. We will have six demonstrations and a BYO lunch afterwards. 
A parking lot behind the museum is available for free parking ON WEEKENDS ONLY.
